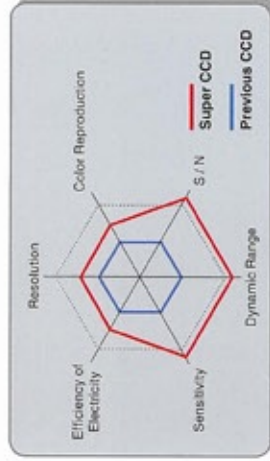
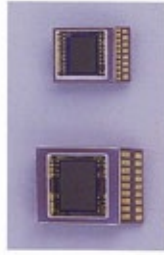

The Australasian Day Surgery Association (ADSA) name was changed this year to reflect the true geographic scope and the change from day surgeries to day hospitals as set out in the Broader Health Cover Legislation.

The board of your association has determined its major focus, the wants and needs of Day Hospitals, so as to meet these and provide value as well as support to our members. Under Leith MacMillan's chairmanship state committees were established and these have grown in strength.

Initiatives started in 2007 include group purchasing, collective bargaining, a survey on day hospitals attitudes to registrar specialist training and a much improved website.

In addition the association is increasingly seen as the peak body representing day hospitals and its advice is sought on many issues.

A new board will be elected during this conference and will determine the plans for the next 12 months.

The adverse outcome events in day hospitals have not formally been surveyed but appear to be less than 1 in 1000 (as opposed to 1 in 6 in overnight hospitals).

Day hospitals have provided medical services in most instances at lesser cost, and at least comparable quality when compared with

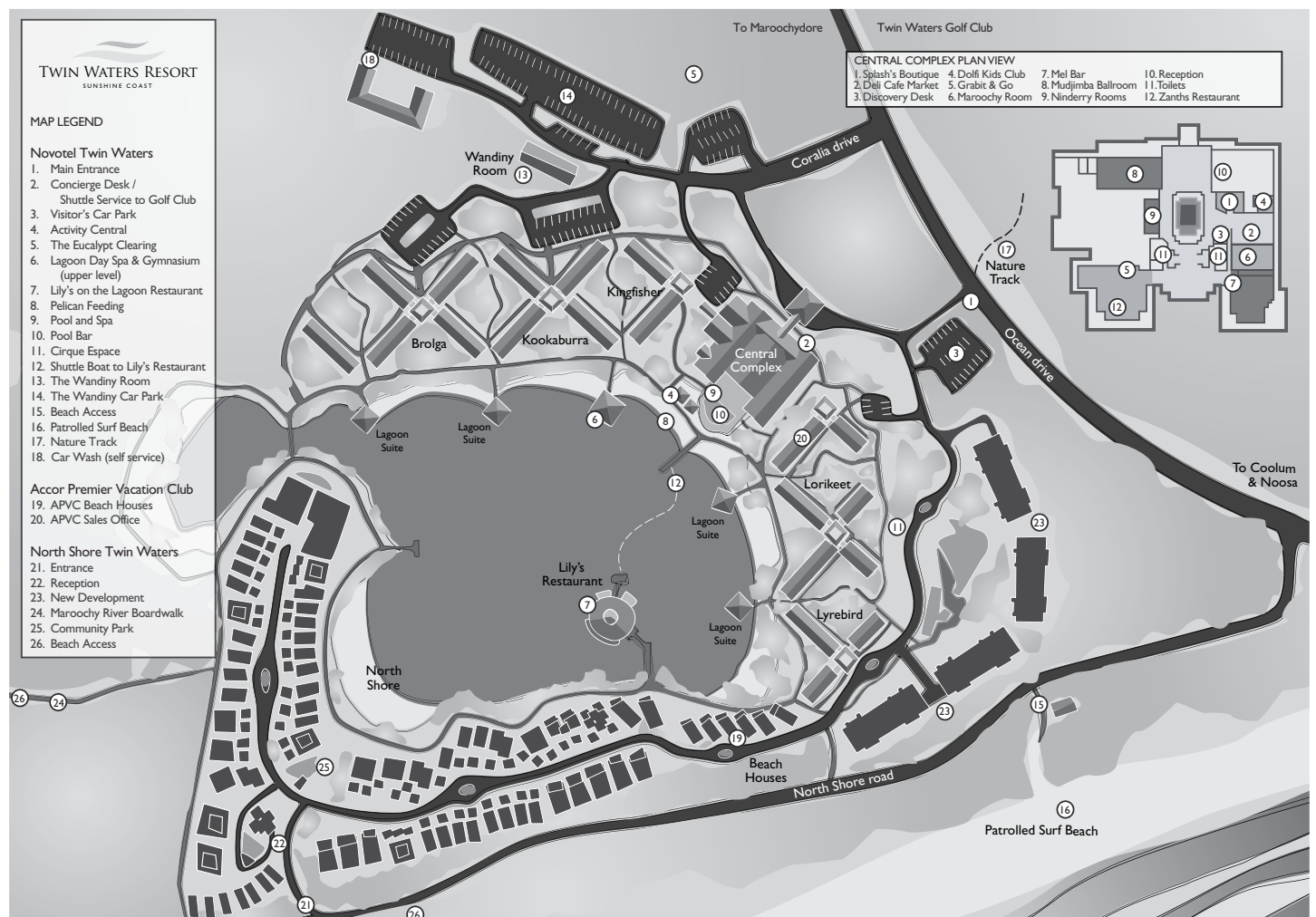
overnight hospitals.

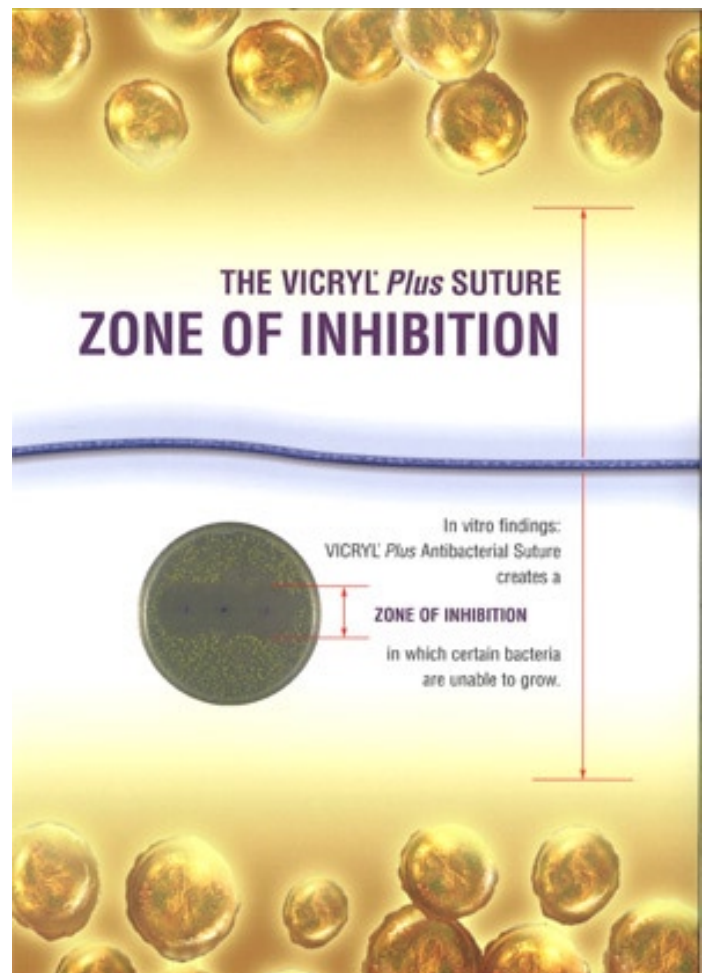

Dr Peter Stephenson. M.B.B.S., F.R.A.C.P.

CEO MONTSERRAT DAY HOSPITAL. QUEENSLAND.

Peter graduated from University of Queensland in 1968. M.R.A.C.P. 1972, F.R.A.C.P. 1975. Entered private practice as a Consultant Gastroenterologist in 1978. He was the founding partner of Brisbane Endoscopy Service in 1985 & subsequently established Montserrat Day Hospitals in 1996. He is currently Chair of the Australian Day Hospital Association.

Dr Rosanna Capolingua

PRESIDENT FEDERAL AUSTRALIAN MEDICAL ASSOCIATION. CANBERRA.

Dr Rosanna Capolingua graduated from the University of Western Australia in 1983 and has been a GP for some 20 years. She has been the principal of her own general practice since 1995.

She was elected to the AMA(WA) Council in 1994, and became that Association's first female, and the youngest, President in 1998.

At a Federal level, Dr Capolingua has been a member of the AMA Council for more than nine years, six years of that on the Federal Executive and the last two years as Treasurer. Dr Capolingua was elected AMA President on 27 May 2007.

Dr Capolingua has also been chair of the Federal AMA Ethics and Medico Legal Committee. She is also a member of the Council of MDA National, and the boards of MercyCare, the UWA Raine Foundation, Healthway and the Board of Governors of University of Notre Dame, Australia. She has also served on the Medical Board of WA.

At the invitation of Federal Health Minister Tony Abbott, Dr Capolingua was also appointed to two National Health and Medical Research Council advisory bodies – the Human Genetics Advisory Committee and the Australian Health Ethics Committee.

Associate Professor John Kearney

OPHTHALMOLOGIST.

John established the Gold Coast Eye Clinic in Southport in 1984. In 1993 he commenced voluntary lectures and skills training in Papua New Guinea. Over the next seven years he joined the mercy ships and the Pacific Island Projects visiting and performing Cataract and other Ophthalmology procedures on the peoples of Vanuatu, New Guinea, Tonga and Tuvalu.

In 2000 commenced the East Timor Eye Project and is currently their team leader. He is a member of the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Ophthalmologists overseas aid committee.

Mr Paul Mackey

AUSTRALIAN PRIVATE HOSPITALS ASSOCIATION.

Paul Mackey is the Director, Policy and Research at the Australian private Hospitals Association (APHA), a position he has held since 2001. APHA is the peak body representing the private hospitals sector. Prior to taking this position with the APHA, Paul was the health policy specialist in the Commonwealth department of parliamentary Services, where he provided the high level health policy analysis and research for members of the Federal Parliament. Paul also provided expert advice to Senate and the House of Representatives Committees conducting inquiries into aspects of the Australian Health System. Paul has qualifications in Arts, Public Policy and Health Economics.

Scott has been employed by the ACCC since 1996 undertaking roles in the ACCC's Canberra, Perth and North Queensland offices. Scott has headed up the ACCC's adjudication branch since late 2004. Among other things, the branch is responsible for administering the public interest authorisation and notification processes allowing arrangements that might otherwise breach the competition provisions of the Trade Practices Act. The authorisation process has brought the ACCC into close contact with the health profession from considering college processes to collective bargaining by doctors.

The Hospital is accredited with the Australian Council on Healthcare Standards and is a teaching hospital of The University of Queensland.

Christine holds a number of Board appointments across local, state and national arenas. She is President of the Australian Private Hospitals Association and Chairs its Safety and Quality Committee and Psychiatry Committee. She is Treasurer of the Private Hospitals Association of Queensland and a member of the Australian Government's 2nd Tier Advisory Committee.

Christine has continually emphasised the necessity for private sector inclusion in the development and implementation of national quality and safety initiatives and was appointed to the former Australian Council for Safety & Quality in Health Care in 2003. In January 2006 Christine was appointed as a Commissioner with the Australian Commission on Safety and Quality in Health Care and she chairs the Commission's Private Hospitals Sector Committee.

Christine was awarded a Centenary Medal for distinguished service to the health industry in April 2003. In recognition of her contribution to the viability, growth, quality and achievements of the private hospital sector, she received the 2005 APHA Individual Achievement Award.

Sans Pareil Pty Ltd: Health and Aged Care Solutions Sans Pareil Pty Ltd (without equal) was started in 2006. From her work in the private health industry, Suellen identified a need for experienced people to represent day hospitals and independent facilities in their associations with health funders.

Some of the key aims of the Company are to assist independent hospitals and day hospitals negotiate health fund contracts including tenders, long and short range strategic planning and implementation, management problem solving, regulatory compliance, new facility organisation, organisational restructuring and contract management.

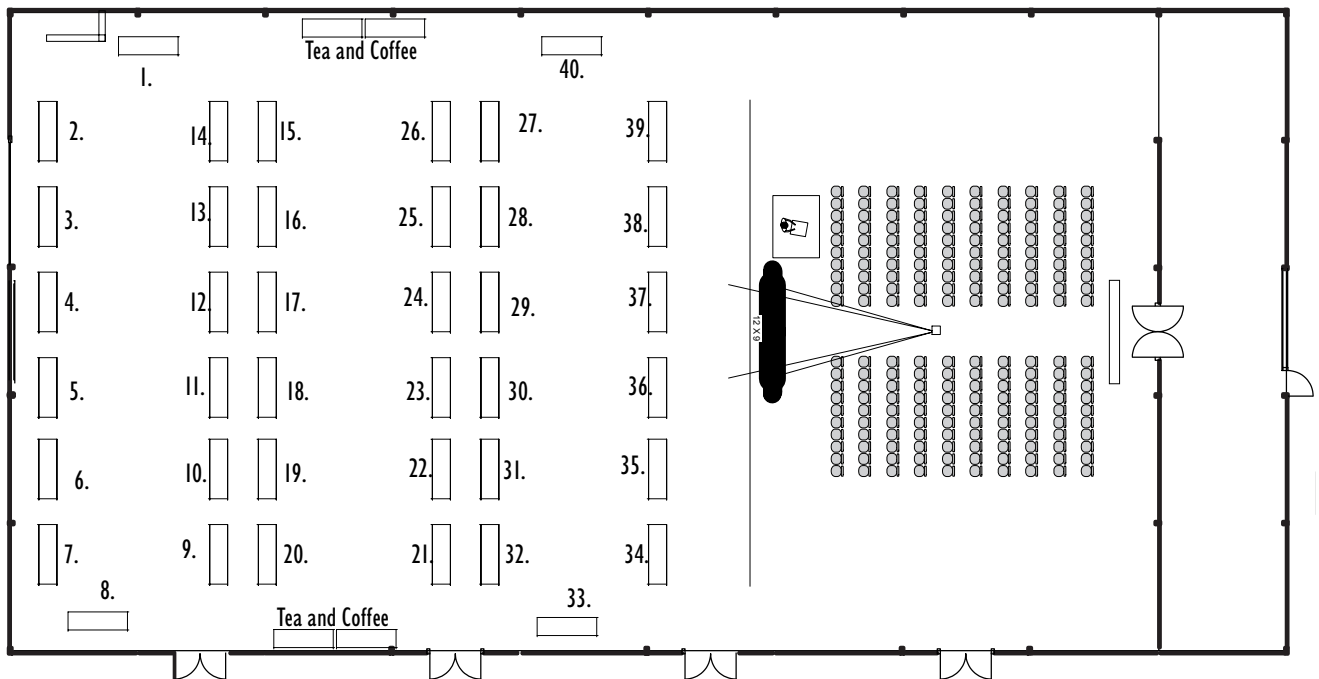

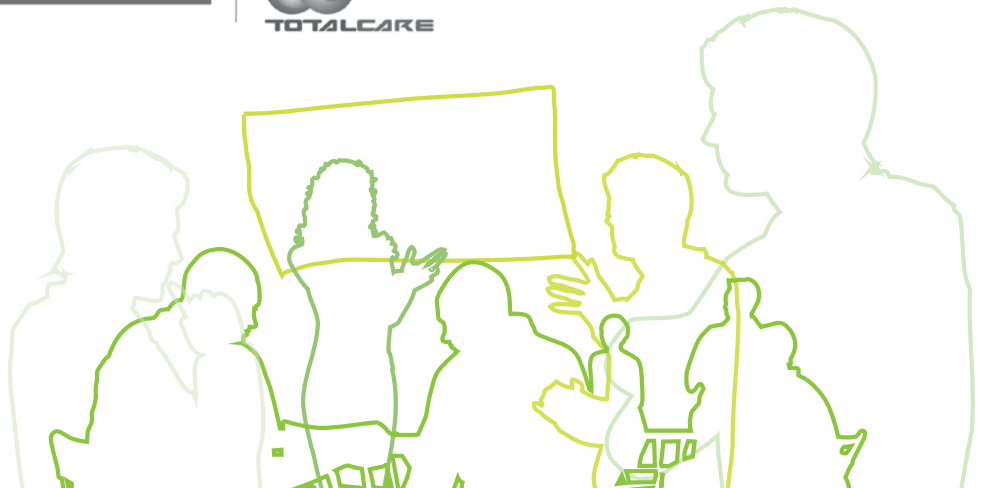
